We're taking a deep dive into the ocean realm in Ocean Exploration camp! During this week we'll be learning about the impact of land use on the oceans, coastal and deep-sea ecology, how coral reefs live and thrive, and conservation challenges and successes to these unique habitats. Note: a preserved animal dissection will be offered during this camp. The dissection is optional and there will be alternate activity offered if campers would like to opt out of the dissection. This camp is being offered again due to popular demand by area students and parents!

Camp Pricing: Once again, DCMM Education is excited to offer tiered pricing so that cost is not a barrier to entry for camp.

Tier A: \$240 - Tier A represents the actual cost of operating summer camp at the Door County Maritime Museum, including long-term wear and tear on reusable equipment, and replacement of consumable materials and items. If you are able to pay this rate, please do so. Your support allows us to continue offering unique STEAM programming!

Tier B: \$170 - Tier B is a partially subsidized rate, but more closely represents the very basics of hosting summer camp. This includes a few non-reusable program supplies and limited maintenance expenses.

Tier C: \$90 - Tier C is subsidized to the greatest possible extent. The generous support of the Sarah Shinn Marshall Fund of the Wisconsin PEO Help fund, the Rotary International District 6220 Program Grant, and the Sturgeon Bay Breakfast Rotary Club as well as Door County Maritime Museum and Lighthouse Preservation Society, Inc. donors allow us to provide for families whose children would not otherwise be able to attend camp.
